Originality

A typical submission made to an assignment in Turnitin generates a Similarity Report. The Similarity Report is the result of comparison between the text of the submission against the search targets selected for the assignment; this may include billions of pages of active and archived internet information, a repository of works previously submitted to Turnitin, and a repository of tens of thousands of periodicals, journals, and publications. Any matching or highly similar text discovered is detailed in the Similarity Report that is available in the Assignment Inbox.

What is Moodle?

Moodle, is the Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) implemented at the UAL. Moodle provides a set of tools that allows lecturers to create and deliver course content and assessments, and communicate via the internet.

Moodle is integrated with other University systems and access is restricted to members of the university.

The general use of Moodle to support your education at UAL it has a number of advantages including:

- Increased access to important course information
- Additional learning support where materials and tools are available
- Allows to undertake aspects of studying anytime or place you have internet access, i.e. outside the classroom.

Why use Moodle?

Moodle provides an ideal mechanism for accessing required course content, such as course handbooks, assessments briefs and other course handouts. Content made available via Moodle can be accessed at any time and from any location where the internet is available. Moodle can host a variety of content from simple text and hyperlinks to more complex content like audio and visual materials.
