

What is Turnitin (Feedback Studio)?

Turnitin have taken the different Feedback features, e.g. Originality Checking, GradeMark, Quickmark and have made them easier and more intuitive to use, with emphasis on providing more contextualized feedback to students.

What are the Key Features?
